- 2. Read and abide by the Election Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Prepare for your candidate speech on February 25, 2016 at 4pm in the UC Commons Area

Applications must be submitted no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, February 19, 2016 in the Smith University Center, Room 205.

Executive Officer Application Requirements:

- Candidates must be students of Francis Marion University.
- Candidates must have a minimum cumulative 2.5 Grade Point Average.
- Minimum credit hours to hold office: President 54 credit hours, Vice President 34 credit hours.
- Candidates must be in good standing with the University.
- Candidates must be in good standing with the Student Government Association, if currently a member.
- Candidates shall hold no other elected or appointed office or position within the Executive or Judicial branches of the SGA, excluding appointments to special committees within and of the SGA that may at times be created for defined purposes for a specific, limited time.

Elections:

- By signing your name on the Candidate Information page of this application, you signify that you have read and agree to be in accordance with the election rules as stated above.
- Candidates also understand any violation of election rules forfeit their right to remain a Candidate for SGA.

- No campaign materials (are to be present within fifty (50) feet of the voting booth. All posters should be moved to an area more than fifty (50) feet away.

Any student who is heard supporting or discouraging the election of any candidate should be asked to leave the area or to cease activity. NO preferential treatment is to be given to any candidate in the voting area. The penalty for violating these rules shall be decided by the Dean of Students Office.
- Candidates may enter the fifty (50) feet "no-campaigning zone" only to vote. A candidate may not view the roll of those who have voted until such a time as the elections are officially over.
