The Academic Affairs Committee (AAC)

promotes student's opinions pertaining to academics at Rensselear. The committee fosters discussion with students, faculty, and administration to encourage new ideas to enhance the academic experience. It also improves and raises awareness of different academic services.

The Facilities & Services Committee (FSC)

develops solutions to promote the betterment of the physical Rensselaer campus and its associated services. FSC (formerly FFA) works to improve campus building and grounds, transportation, safety, and dining services. The Student Life Committee (SLC)

Joint Committees

Pending the approval of the Joint Committee Resolution, the Student Senate and the Executive Board will effectively address issues of general policy and fiscal policy collaboratively through the following joint committees.

The Rules & Elections Committee (R&E)

plays a unique role by overseeing all student government elections and checking the constitutionality of the Senate's By-Laws. Its diverse membership comes from the Senate, Executive Board, Judicial Board, Undergraduate Council, Greek Council, and Independent Council, along with members at large. connects student government with the student body by using public relations events to collect and address student needs. The committee utilizes a variety of communication media throughout the campus and surrounding capital region, and facilitates dialog and collaboration among student government representatives and Institute Administration.
